St Bede's is a school with a strong Catholic ethos. This permeates all areas of school life and is at the heart of our philosophy on education. Our whole curriculum is rooted in a religious understanding of life, with Gospel values underpinning our efforts to provide a quality education for all.

Our dedicated and passionate staff team works hard to provide a safe and stimulating environment where our children can feel secure and excited about learning. Our aim is to nurture the uniqueness of every child and respond to their individual strengths and needs. We aim to equip our children with the tools for future learning and the confidence to follow their dreams.

In establishing these trust structures and having a single system in our Diocese, Bishop Chadwick Catholic Education Trust aims to ensure that children and young people in its schools will continue to receive the very best educational opportunities and life fulfilling experiences, within communities which have Christ and His Church at the very centre.

A Catholic trust model where every school has its place will mean that no individual school will be left isolated or vulnerable in a rapidly changing environment. Admissions Policy

The most recent admissions policy is available from the school or can be viewed on the Local Authority website at www.southtyneside.info/learningandleisure/ under Education and Leisure - Schools.

Admission to Nursery

The Nursery provides part-time education for up to 26 children in the morning session which begins at 9.00am, finishing at 12.00pm. Each child attends 5 sessions per week.

The Nursery is non-denominational (Catholic and non-Catholic children are welcome).

For children who have reached their third birthday, places, if available, will be offered at the beginning of each term.

In the event of there being more children than places, preference has to be given, out of fairness, to those parents who made the earliest application to the School.

Admission to Nursery does not give a child an automatic right of admission to the main Primary School.

Admission of Children with Special Educational Needs

Admission would be based on the above policies taking into account the physical layout of the school.

Visits by Parents

Parents are very welcome to visit the school. It would be helpful if you could make an appointment if you wish to see the Head Teacher. Staff will be happy to discuss progress or concerns but again an appointment should be made wherever possible.

Our Nursery and Reception classes form the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) where there is emphasis on learning through indoor and outdoor play.

The 7 areas of learning in the EYFS.

The prime areas of learning:

- · communication and language
- physical development
- · personal, social and emotional development

The specific areas of learning:

- literacy
- mathematics
- · understanding the world
- · expressive arts and design

Religious Education

In our Catholic school, RE is a Core Subject and the whole ethos of the school is informed by our religious beliefs. While parents have the right of withdrawal of their children from religious worship and education, we remind them that the school exists to give a Catholic education and parents should, therefore, be in sympathy with its aims and objectives. We would not expect any Catholic

parent to send his/her child to this school and then ask for that child to be excused religious education or worship. Similarly, should a non-Catholic parent request a place for his/her child in this school, it would be stressed that the overlying tone of the school is Catholic and that our beliefs often find their way into subjects other than Religious Education.

A Religious Education scheme called 'Come and See' is used alongside other material. For 2 weeks in each year the children also learn about other faiths – Judaism and Islam.

The programme for First Holy Communion is Parish-based and the school's teaching complements this.

Special Educational Needs

In accordance with the Code of Practice for Special Educational Needs, every care is taken to ensure that children with special educational needs are well catered for in the school and parents are, of course, informed of these needs and of the measures we adopt to cater for them.

Assessment/Reporting to Parents

Pupils are formally assessed at the end of Key Stage 1 (Year 2) and Key Stage 2 (Year 6) following statutory procedure. Individual results will be available to parents and the results for the class provided for all parents. No pupil will be named in these results. Teacher assessment is ongoing and assists in planning work appropriate to each individual, group, or the class.

We hold parental interviews twice a year in the Autumn and Spring Terms. These provide parents with an excellent opportunity to discuss their child's progress. They are a very important element of our home/school partnership and we urge parents to attend. We try to be flexible with the times we offer, and we are always willing to accommodate parents who find it difficult to attend at the appointed time. A written report, in line with legislation, is provided in the Summer Term.

Behaviour Policy

We encourage a positive, orderly atmosphere both around the school and within the classroom. Emphasis is placed on praise and rewarding pupils for good behaviour and creating an atmosphere in which good behaviour is encouraged. We aim to develop mutual respect, social responsibility and self-discipline in a caring and Christian community.

Systems to encourage good behaviour:

School Teams and the Merit System

All the children in KS1 and KS2 are divided into four teams, ie. St Aidan (Blue), St Bede (Green), St Cuthbert (Red) and St Hilda (Yellow). The children are allocated to their team in Reception class and remain in that team throughout their time at St Bede's. Team Captains are elected for the year from the children in Year 6.

Good behaviour is encouraged by awarding merits for good work and good behaviour generally.

Home/School Links

The School aims to develop strong links with the parents of the children. We wish to encourage parents to feel valued as full partners in the learning process and to feel welcome in the School. Homework

Nursery – Children borrow books to share at home.

Reception – Reading books are taken home after the first half-term.

KS1 & KS2 – Children are encouraged to share books at home, learn times tables, practice spellings and participate in Mathletics challenges.

In addition, KS2 children will carry out research projects at various times throughout the year. Please note that homework will not be set for children who are ill or on holiday.

Complaints

Any parent wishing to make a complaint should first contact the Head Teacher who will be happy to discuss any problems and, if necessary, advice on how to seek further information. A Complaints Policy is available on request.

Loss of, or Damage to, Clothing Whilst on School Property

The Local Authority is unable to accept legal responsibility for personal property which is brought onto the school premises and which is lost or damaged as a result of the acts of third parties. The Council's Insurers do not cover losses of this nature. The matter will, however, be reported to the Local Authority at the earliest opportunity for their consideration of an ex gratia payment on your behalf. It must be pointed out, however, that this latter course of action is not always totally successful.

The National School Breakfast Programme

Our school has joined the government's National School Breakfast Programme (NSBP), which is being delivered by the charities Family Action and Magic Breakfast.

As an NSBP School, we are pleased to announce that we soon be able to offer all our children a healthy school breakfast. As a result, they will be able to enjoy the benefit of being settled in school and ready to learn at the start of the day.

Every morning, **each child** will be able to access a free breakfast. We are going to be offering bagels in the school hall between 8.30am and 9.00am.

School Health and Safety

We do not employ a full-time school nurse. First aid treatment is available from trained members of staff:

Please keep your children at home if they are ill. This is particularly important in the case of infectious diseases.

If your child has **sickness and/or diarrhoea**, we kindly request they **stay off school for 48 hours** from the last episode.

We ask all parents to provide us with at least **two emergency contact numbers** so that they can be notified if their child becomes ill during the school day. **It is most important parents inform school of any telephone number changes.**

Medicines

The school is able to administer some medicine. If a child has been prescribed medication, which needs a lunchtime dose then parents are welcome to come into school and sign a form allowing staff to administer the medication.

Children requiring inhalers have access to them when necessary.

We are trying to promote healthy eating throughout the school. Children may bring a piece of fruit to eat during playtime. We **do not allow sweets or snacks** of any description in school, unless requested by the class teacher eg. a class event/celebration.

Child Protection

Parents should be aware that the school will take any reasonable action to ensure the safety of its pupils. In cases where the school has reason to be concerned that a pupil may be subject to ill-treatment, neglect or other forms of abuse, staff have no alternative but to follow Child Protection Procedures and inform Social Services of their concern.

No Smoking Policy

Please note that smoking is not allowed anywhere on the school premises which includes the playgrounds and car park.

Road Safety

In the interest of children's safety, please <u>do not park on the yellow zigzag lines</u> outside the school gates and do not encourage children to stand at the entrance of the car park or meet you in the car park.

Pastoral Care

Teachers are responsible for the intellectual, spiritual and moral development of each child in their care during the school day. The class teacher will initially deal with any worries concerning a child or worries expressed by a child but, of course, the whole school community has the welfare of all the children in mind.

Close contact between home and school also ensures that the needs of the child are known and understood by both teacher and parent.

School Uniform

We are very proud of our school uniform and ask parents to support us in encouraging its use.

All uniform should have your child's name clearly marked on.

We ask the boys to wear:

- Winter mid-grey long trousers, blue polo shirt and school sweatshirt.
- Summer mid-grey short trousers may be worn (optional).





We ask the girls to wear:

- Winter/Summer mid-grey skirt, pinafore or trousers, blue polo shirt and school sweatshirt/cardigan.
- Summer light blue and white checked dress (optional).







Please ensure that your child wears **sensible black shoes** and socks/tights in keeping with the school uniform. If boots are worn in the winter, a change of shoes must be brought into school.

School sweatshirts, polo shirts, fleeces, hats, caps and PE kit embroidered with our school logo can be purchased direct from www.myclothing.com also from **J K Clothing** (North East) Ltd, Ellison Street, Jarrow.

For safety reasons, **no jewellery**, apart from wristwatches, is allowed.

Hair colours and extreme hairstyles, shaved areas or whole heads, Mohican cuts etc. are not allowed. We kindly ask parents to co-operate with this policy at all times.

Children are expected to have a school book bag and PE bag. These can be paid for via ParentPay and once payment has been received, will be given to the child.

School Meals

The meals are cooked on the premises by the kitchen staff supervised by Mrs Fallon, our Cook. The service is operated by the Local Authority and is independent of the school. The meals are served in the dining room between 11.45am and 1.00pm.

Those children who do not want school meals may bring a packed lunch.

Whether you are choosing school meals or packed lunch for your child, we kindly ask they have one or the other for the full week.

Any special dietary needs should also be brought to the attention of the school.

KS2 Dinner Money

Dinner money is £2.20 per day and must be paid via ParentPay, which is an online payment service for schools. Meals must be paid for in advance or on the day of the meals being taken to keep parents' accounts in credit.

On your child starting school, you will be given a username and password to allow you to activate your ParentPay account. We are a cash-free school, so no money will be accepted by the School Office.

EYFS and KS1 Meals

Every child in or entering Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will receive a free school lunch under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meals initiative. However, parents who think they are entitled to free school meals, still need to apply by completing the appropriate form and returning it to the school office. A check will be carried out and parents will be informed if it comes back as 'not eligible'. This allows EYFS and KS1 children access to free milk in school under the council's school milk scheme and ensures school receives the Pupil Premium – an additional sum of money which helps support the education of children entitled to free school meals.

School Milk

All primary school children who are eligible for free school meals **due to family income circumstances** are also entitled to free school milk.

Milk is available to all other primary school children. The price for the school year 2021-22 is £9.10 per term.

The milk provided is a 189/200ml carton of semi-skimmed per day during term time. The charge for milk is subsidised by the European Community and the Welfare Food Reimbursement Unit.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club runs from 7.50am to 8.50am every school day. Places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Due to high demand and limited spaces, it is **essential that bookings are made in advance by contacting Mrs Taylor on 07765 271913,** otherwise places cannot be guaranteed. **Please allow a minimum of 24 hours' notice to ensure that the correct levels of staff are in attendance.** We also accept bookings at short notice (in an emergency), as long as spaces are available.

The cost is £2.50 per session for the first child and £1.50 for each additional child. Payment MUST be made online via ParentPay, either in advance or on the day of the booking.

Please ensure that you accompany your child(ren) into the building and hand them over to a member of staff.

Children are provided with a healthy breakfast (specific dietary requirements will be met wherever possible). Every day we have a wide range of art and craft based activities, games and toys to play with and outdoor play.

Teatime Club

Teatime Club runs from 3.15pm to 5.15pm every night after school. Places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis. It is essential that you book places in advance by contacting Mrs Taylor on 07765 271913 or Mrs Kelly on 07981 531553, otherwise places cannot be guaranteed.

The cost is £2.50 per child for up to one hour and £5.00 per child for up to two hours. **Payment MUST be made online via ParentPay, either in advance or on the day of the booking**.

Children are provided with a healthy snack (specific dietary requirements will be met wherever possible). Every day we have a wide range of art and craft based activities, games and toys to play with and outdoor play.

Governors' Charging - Remissions Policy

St Bede's has always had excellent support for school trips, visits or additional activities such as puppet shows etc. Children gain valuable experience and the work done in preparation and follow-

up is a very important part of the school curriculum. Education provided by the school should be free of charge if it takes place wholly or mainly during school hours. Unfortunately, because of limited school funds, it would not be possible to continue these activities without asking for voluntary parental contributions.

School Attendance Regulations

It is necessary for parents to inform school of the **reason for any absence** from school. *Please telephone school by 9.30am on the first day of absence.* If you have not made contact with school by 9.30am on the first day of absence, the school office will contact you initially by text. You will be asked to telephone school to register the absence.

If an absence runs into a second week you are asked to telephone school on the Monday of the second week.

Schools are required to publish details of all unauthorised absences from school. We are also required to supply the information to the LA for monitoring purposes.

Please note that we are also obliged to indicate late arrivals on the register. Persistent late arrival is regarded as 'failing to ensure regular attendance at school'. Children arriving after the bell must be brought to the school office by an adult, where a Latecomers Slip will be completed.

Holidays during Term Time

We have received notification from the DfE (Department for Education) that Head Teachers are **no longer allowed** to grant Leave of Absence for the purpose of a family holiday during term time. Absence from will only be granted in exceptional circumstances.
